Apex 40 Australia Inc. is not a Service Club, but an organisation formed to foster fellowship among past Apexians and their partners, and to retain the many friendships formed during their Apex years.

It also exists to assist Apex, when asked, and not to operate in opposition to Apex. It is open to past members and their partners, and Ex-World Councillors who have retired from their respective organisations.

Some Apex forty members decided to form sub-committees which are based around past or present Apex Club locations. These sub-committees may meet monthly or less regularly, but all with a view to maintaining and fostering friendships and occasionally helping Apex Clubs.

Each year members from Apex 40 gather for a weekend to attend the Annual Convention known as 'The Rort'. During this weekend there is a brief interruption to the festivities to conduct the necessary formality of The Annual General Meeting. In the past, after the RORT, a Post-RORT tour of 4 or 5 days duration has been programmed, visiting areas surrounding the town hosting The Rort. In future both events may be combined and shortened to reduce costs.

The socialising of individual members with each other, across the whole organisation, never ceases. When on an interstate holiday, for example, members invariably look up acquaintances and friends made during the Rorts. It is a huge social club and fosters friendships among whole families.

Membership is open to all past members of Apex, their partners, and members of affiliated clubs.

WEB Master Position:

As the position of Membership is a position nominated by the Board, the holder of this position does not need to register with ASIC.

Position Description and Procedures:

- a) Maintain the Apex 40 WEB site www.apex40.com ensuring privacy for all members.
- b) Maintain files, email user names and email redirections on the Apex 40 Server.
- c) Assist nominated members with other social media platforms including Facebook.
- d) produce flyers for Rorts and other events including forms as requested by the National Board;
- e) Attend National Board meetings either in person or by electronic media (Zoom, email or other electronic method).
- f) Other duties as requested by the National Board

WEB Page and Domains:

The Webmaster:

- 1) must have some knowledge or be guided/trained on the use of CPanel which is located on the Apex 40 webserver;
- 2) must have some knowledge on how to produce a webpage/s and upload it/them to the server;
- 3) may ask the National Board to authorise the purchase software for completing these tasks;
- 4) shall create and delete email users and email forwarders using cpanel, the webmaster will need to understand how this is achieved;
- 5) will need to work with the treasurer when providing online payments on the website;
- 6) will need to provide links to other organisations that Apex 40 has a relationship with;
- 7) must keep updating or refreshing the website including the latest roaring 40's, so the site is relevant;

- 1) Apex 4 Facebook has several administrators, the webmaster being one of them.

FROM THE TREASURER'S DESK.

REPORT FOR THE ROARING 40'S SEPTEMBER 2026

CREDIT CARDS

We currently use a third-party supplier SQUARE to process our Credit Card transactions. This system works well, however the 2.28% processing fees charged by them is off-putting to our members.

We are currently trialling two alternative Credit Card options with our bankers, Westpac. Their processing rate is 1.4%, and we are running SQUARE & WESTPAC systems concurrently, until October 2026, when the Reserve Bank will introduce new rules about passing on credit card fees to users.

When booking for the 2027 RORT, we will issue an Invoice which will give you the options of either paying by Direct Credit (no fees) or utilising our Credit Card facilities.

2027 RORT

Registrations are progressing well and we currently have 74 registrations to attend the 2027 Central Coast RORT NSW.

Plenty of accommodation is still available. See the report from Maggie Vincent in this issue for updates.

Click on this link [RORTinfo](#) to take you to the 2027 RORT Registration details. A deposit of \$100 per person is required at the time of booking.

RORTERS are reminded that FULL PAYMENTS are not due until 31/03/2027. We will issue a reminder Statement to RORTERS in the new year.

2028 RORT

National President, Vic Ashby, recently called for Expressions of Interest for hosting of the 2028 RORT. No expressions of interest have been received, and as the timing of planning & organising a RORT is a lengthy process (i.e. Bookings, planning, Creation of Web page etc), our National Board have agreed to make a booking at the Crystal Brook Tourist Park at Doncaster East (Warrandyte) 26kms northeast of the Melbourne CBD during the period 19/3/2028 - 25/3/2028.

We have booked the entire Tourist Park for powered sites and cabins, and planning has commenced on bringing the 2028 RORT to Melbourne.

A sub-committee comprising National Secretary, National Treasurer, National Vice President and Trevor Hookey (Melbourne Gippsland Apex 40, son of the late Neil Hookey) has been formed to plan & organise the 2028 RORT.

The 2028 RORT will be ratified at the 2027 RORT at Bateau Bay NSW. This RORT will be run on revised guidelines, as circulated by National Secretary Mark Tramby in August 2026 via our Facebook page, and a survey conducted with a small number of regular RORT attendees.

Expressions of interest are called for any sub-committee wishing to host the 2029 RORT.

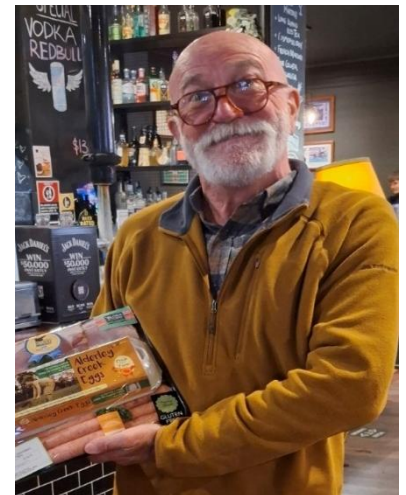
