

PRESIDENT 3 MESSAGE

The 5th Apex 40 Rort and annual meeting is fast approaching (or may even have past by the time some of you receive this) and with it comes the end of my term as National President. It has been a great honour and a considerable pleasure to have held this position in these still formative days of Apex 40, and I look forward to seeing a continuing expansion of the organisation throughout further parts of the country.

The major task for myself and Secretary Geoff Angus has been the production of Roaring 40's and we have found this very enjoyable, particularly as it gives us the opportunity to keep in touch with the branches from whom we are continually soliciting information. We hope that you have enjoyed reading Roaring 40's. Geoff has been busy writing to new and prospective branches and forwarding on information to assist them in the formation and operation of branches. This task is shared with Extension Chairman Lionel Mussell and their labours have recently been further rewarded with the formation of a new branch at Stawell (Vic) and affiliation of Illawarra Apex 40 (Wollongong, MSW) which has been active, but not affiliated, for the last few years. I would like to record my thanks for the work done by Geoff and Lionel during these past two years.

The formation of new branches is always a matter of great satisfaction to me as it ensures the continuing success of Apex 40. Though growth has been slow, it has been steady and there is every indication that it will continue. Having now at least one branch in each of the eastern States, there is no doubt that growth will continue in this area. While we have had correspondence with past-Apexians in both South Australia and Western Australia, and we know that there are ex-Apex groups active in Perth at least, we have not been able to manage the birth of an Apex 40 branch as such in these areas. We did have a branch in Darwin at one time, but it seems to have collapsed in the heat or been washed away during the 'wet'. Then again, it may still be active but uncommunicative - we hope it is still in existence.

Obviously, there is unlimited scope for expansion and I believe we have a very solid base on which to build.

One thing that gave me particular pleasure in the past year was the favourable attitude of Apex National President Ian Main. This resulted in us publishing an article about Apex 40 in the Apexian and at least one contact for a potential new branch. Ian's term as Mational President has just now finished and I would like to thank him for the assistance and encouragement he has given to Apex 40. We hope that relations with Apex will continue to be as friendly and co-operative.

The stated aim of Apex 40 is 'for continuing fellowship' and I have constantly stressed the opportunity it affords for continuing those valued friendships we made in Apex. The more I am involved in Apex 40, the more I find however that this is only part of the story. Both in my own Melbourne-Gippsland branch and by attendance at the annual Rorts, I have made many new friendships with fellows and their wives that I had not known in my Apex days. I can now claim new friendships, which I hope will be long lasting, with Apex 40 members from Queensland to Tasmania, apart from many fine new friends on the local scene.

After two years as National President, I am even more convinced of the value of Apex 40.
