

EXTENSION REPORT

Sunraysia District held its inaugural meeting last September in Mildura. National President Ern was in attendance and the 30 couples present were past members of Merbein, Mildura, Red Cliffs and Wentworth Apex Clubs. Further to earlier advice to Branch Secretaries we have now finalised arrangements to have made standardised name badges for members as decided at the Maryborough Rort. The badge will be of royal blue formica material in a triangular shape incorporating the Apex 40 emblem with member's name and branch etched in gold. from those who have not yet paid so that we may balance the budget which is under pressure from the cost of the Apex 40 leaflet and the increasing cost of producing Roaring 40's.
