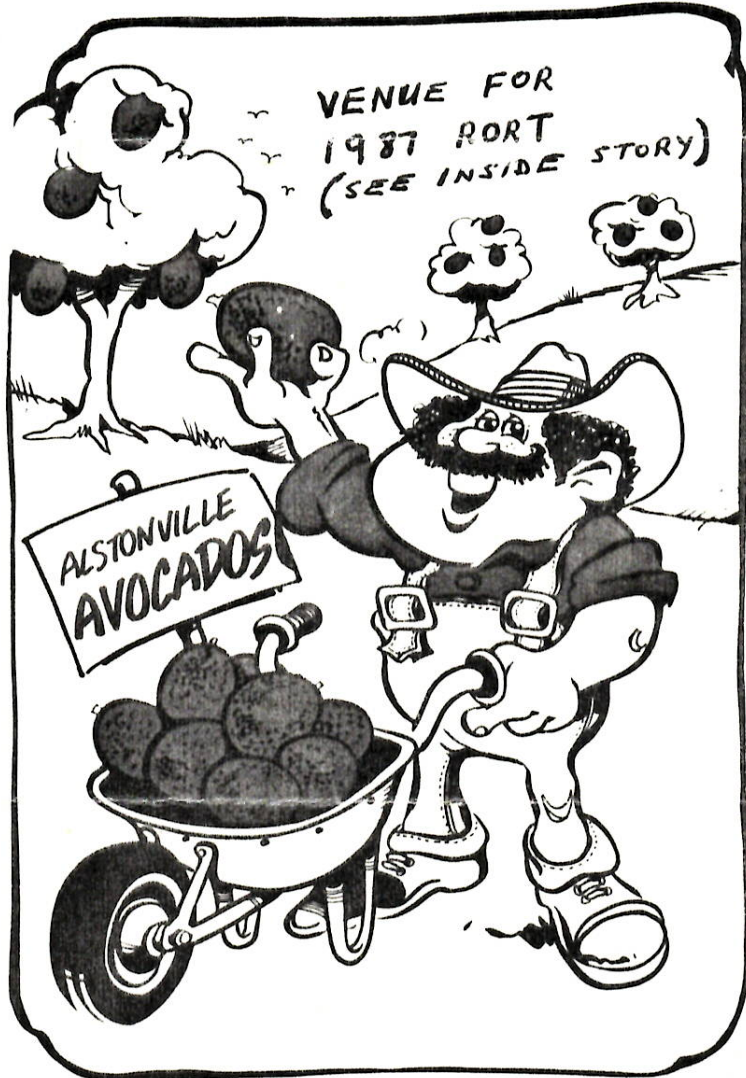

Through Kevin Muxham retiring as Zone President of Zone 5 new club at Alstonville has been formed with a total of 33 members (including ladies).

The members who were in Apex last year ran the Zone Convention for about 400 and with the help of the local Apex Club feel they can run a Rort.

Kevin has advised that:-

Alstonville is a delightful rural village set on a red basalt soil plateau of 170m elevation and a population of around 4,000. Located half way between Ballina on the coast (pop.11,500) and Lismore (pop.35,000), 10 miles from both, it is sub tropical in climate and a very popular fruit growing area. Mainly avocados, macadamia nuts, custard apples, lychees, peaches, nectarines and sugar cane are grown in the area.

It is a popular retirement village where people are very garden conscious. Having won the last four years, its population category in the Tidy Towns competition, it took out the outright State Winner last year. We know you will love the place as we all do.
