

"Jacarandalanders" Rort 1992

By now members should have received registration forms for the 1992 Rort — if not, contact your Branch Secretary who will have copies.

The 1992 Rort will be held at Grafton, NSW, on the banks of the mighty Clarence River, from Friday the 5th to Monday the 8th of June, and a Post-Rort Tour is planned to take in Northern NSW and the Gold Coast.

Rort functions will include:

Sounds like a great programme there should be time to fit in the Rort business session on Saturday afternoon. The full registration fee of \$110 seems to represent extremely good value, and the motel prices are quite reasonable. There is also the option of staying in a caravan park in cabins and on-site vans — or bring your own caravan or camper. We know that a number of Rorters from Victoria, and perhaps Tasmania, will be bringing caravans and campers. If you are booking a caravan site or cabin etc., please forward the equivalent of one night's cost with your registration.

Remember — Registrations, together with registration fee of \$20, plus accommodation deposits (\$100 per room), are to be in before 31st January 1992 to ensure your booking. Balance of payment for Rort functions is required by 31st March, but it would assist greatly if the full amount could be paid by the 31st of January.
