



The Rort committee was unanimous for the Rort program which should be good at the one venue, an enjoyable time is assured with the entertainment we have booked.


WYONG POST RORT TOUR

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL BRANCH SECRETARIES



Thanks very much to Brian for handling this job for many years and thanks also to Sandy for taking over the task.


