Nineteen members competed in the clubs lawn bowls competition in September and there were two winners with 5 games each.



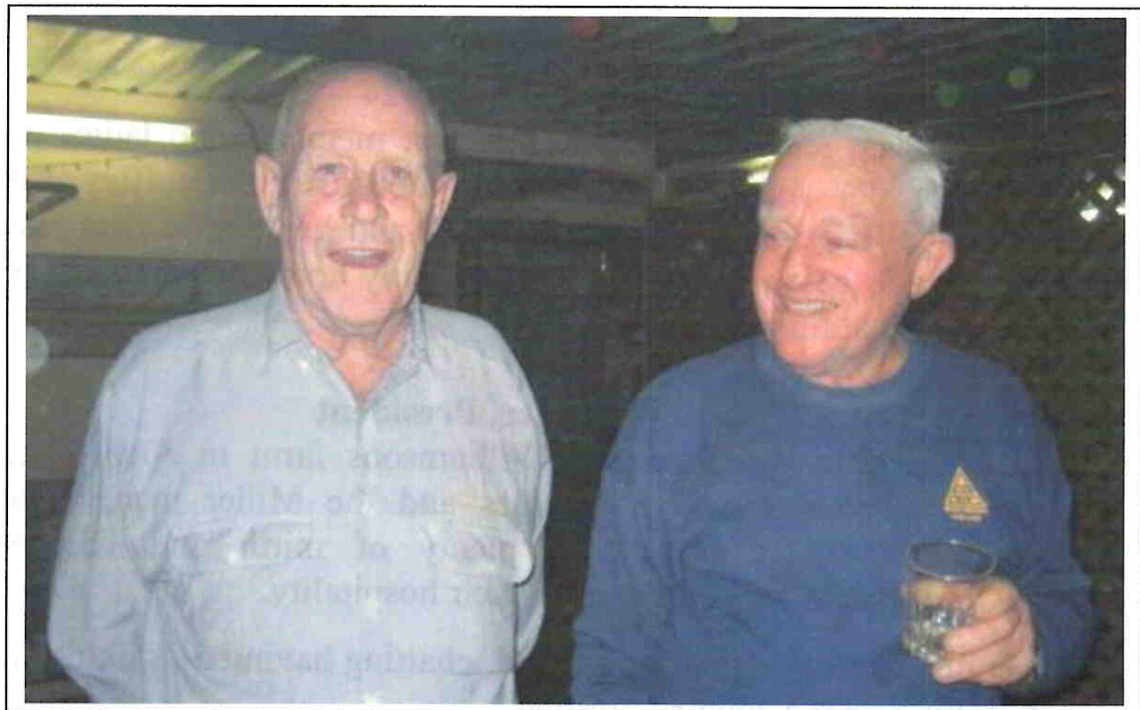
Esthere Quill and Ron Miller showed them how it was done. A good time was had by all.

According to Muster co-ordinator Brian Sansom this is Australia's biggest outdoor country music event and as such there are many nationwide benefits. He said the music festival, sponsored by Toyota and many other companies hoped to gross \$5 million in 2008.

The Gympie Apex Club carries the risk, but it is worth it, as the event does a lot for our community and tourism. It requires a huge effort to set up a site in a state forest but fortunately another 50 organisations assist and are rewarded for their efforts. Profits are widely distributed.
