

MELBOURNE-GIPPSLAND - Geoff Angus, President



We are meeting with our service providers to fine tune program items and ensure all goes smoothly, with numbers now well over budget we are sure we can add things to make your Rort more enjoyable and affordable.

Happy Days dress is encouraged on both Saturday and Sunday night (all weekend if this takes your fancy), get ready to swing. As discussed we are planning something a little different for skits so you do not need to arrange anything prior to the Rort.

His tireless work was recognised when Mr Rumble was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for service to the community. A Penrith Council staffer for 31 years and a councillor for four, Mr Rumble worked tirelessly to improve the health and safety of the people of Penrith.

With an OAM under his belt, you might think Mr Rumble is ready for a well-earned break. But think again.

"I'd like to see botanical gardens in Penrith," he said. "Then there's a master plan for Jamison Park to bring it up to scratch."

"And the Great River Walk is still on the agenda," Mr Rumble said. "There's still a lot of work to do."
