National President's Report Alan Bach - XEPA

Since the last issue devastation caused by fire, wind, and flooding has been continually in the news while parts suffer heat waves and or drought. As far as I can ascertain none of our members suffered too badly during this time, even though some were in very close proximity to some of the worst events. Places that members visited during the last Rort and Post Rort Tour were among the worst affected in the country. A number of members

have reported that, at times recently they have had river frontage properties.

The Gympie Apex Muster site was completely ravaged during the recent flooding. Most of the infrastructure was completely destroyed and the site is littered with natural and man made debris. A passionate plea has gone out for urgent assistance. Quite a large contingent of volunteers is expected at the site on March 9th for a big clean-up. As I write, another large rain cell is positioned over Gympie and even more flooding and damage is feared. Check the Apex 40 Website for details and photos.

On Festivals, Mary and I recently attended the bi-annual Chinchilla Melon Festival on the Darling Downs in Queensland and thoroughly enjoyed the well organised event. It was pleasing to see a strong contingent of local Apexians flying the flag and working at 100% capacity A quarter of Australia's melons come from Chinchilla. I'm sure we will return to the festival in 2015.

Sadly we have lost another Apex 40 member, Margaret Dunn from Wyong and our condolences go to Geoff and family. Also Margaret Hookey from Melbourne has had a set back and our thoughts are with her and Neil.

With the addition of the expertise of our two extra National Board members it complicated our national video link ups. Bandwidth caused us some issues initially but it looks like Ken, with his knowledge, has come to the rescue for us again. Adding Ken to the Board has been a major bonus to the organisation and Bob's invaluable knowledge has helped immeasurably. Bob has been given the new 'Membership Directorship'. I am very pleased with the work Ken has done on the website recently (as well as his contribution to the Magazine). Some members have phoned to let me know that they had been having problems accessing the new updated Website. Pressing the 'Refresh Button' does the trick.

As we go to print, there are still some cabins available for the 2013 Rort. It is pleasing to see that we already have a good rollup. Others have indicated to us that they will be attending so hopefully they will also book soon. Our New Caledonian friends are certainly looking forward to our visit to Noumea and are in the process of organising a welcoming function for those interested. They certainly treated Mary and I to their

warm hospitality on our visit last October. I look forward to seeing you on the Cruise.

Our National Board meetings have posed a number of questions about many things taken for granted in our organisation: why is it so, how did things evolve, what was intended and are we continuing to follow the intent and also our international relationships with other Apex Nations? We have had to annoy Alan Kinder and his compatriots on a number of occasions but even they did not have all the answers. By the time of the AGM we should have a better understanding of all things Apex 40. As a result of our enquiries, Alan has agreed to assist us with compiling an electronically stored history of Apex 40 by providing information on the early days. Anyone else who has something to add would be most welcome to do so.

For the last dozen years or so Apex 40 Name Badges have been ordered off Alan Flaherty and he has them manufactured by a fellow in his locality. Due to the need for us to improve and meet legal and constitutional requirements, all badges must now be ordered through the National Secretary. Alan Flaherty will still be in charge of manufacture and delivery of the badges. For many years we have overlooked to thank Alan for his efforts. On behalf of all the members of Apex 40 Alan, THANK-YOU. Continuing along the same vane, Glenn Rossiter has looked after the procurement and sale of Car Stickers for many years – Thanks Glenn.

On Fraser Island a decision was made to have National Board organise the 2014 Rort in South Australia. Vice President Brian volunteered to research some possibilities and develop a plan. After many months of work, combined with consistent clogging of my In Box, filling it with ideas and possibilities, a plan was formulated. The Board studied and approved Brian's final proposals and have given the go ahead to book venues, transport, caterers etc. The Rort will be held from the 2nd to 5th May 2014 with the PRT following immediately after. Thanks Brian, for the many hours of research and planning. Make a note of the Dates and keep them in your personal calendar. A promotion will appear on the website in due course.

At the recent Board Meeting, I.R.O. Mark raised the issue that it is a long time since Apex 40 has had a 'Mass Tour'. Consensus was that something could possibly be organised for Year 2015. Please let Mark know what you think.

As of June this year the Apex Australia State Bodies will disappear and Apex Australia will operate as a National Body only. The Apex Australia National Convention will be held in Alice Springs where Kate Huth from Western Australia will take over as National President. IRO Mark is a friend of Kate's parents from Apex days and has been in contact with Kate. Apex 40 has been invited to attend the Apex National Convention in Alice Springs in October. There will be no Queensland Apex State Convention this year but a State Awards weekend to be held at Mudjimba on May 12th to 14th. Apex 40 has been invited to participate, at the sort of 'swansong', and the State Branch is looking forward to our attendance.

The MOU between Apex Australia and Apex 40 will not be considered until both organisations have gone through their current upgrades and are in a position to do so. With all that is going on at present the MOU is not a priority. Rest assured, both organisations are keeping and will keep in contact. The position of Apex 40 Australia operating totally in its own right is nearly complete and Apex Australia has been going through a major restructuring phase.

The Apex 40 National Board is compiling a set of Duties and Responsibilities for the various Board Positions to assist new executives in maintaining a flow on covering the basic requirements for each position. Also a 'Document of Assistance' pertaining to Rorts, containing historical data and procedure, is well in preparation to give guidance to future Rort and Post Rort Tour Organisers.

Some misunderstanding or misconception has arisen regarding membership and Insurance and has been brought to our attention; Please see Col's report for verification that the \$6.00 National Membership Fee covers all expenses, including insurance and administration etc. Would all group secretaries please submit the due membership fees to the National Secretary/Treasurer as soon as possible. Annual Subs have been kept to a low level in the hope that 'Groups' would remit their dues on time. It is imperative that all members be covered under our insurance scheme. Thanks to all who have already paid. For others, please spend a little time, tend to the matter and put things in order. Prompt attention to detail will make Col's task so much easier.

Precises of National Board meeting:

A meeting of the National Board was held at the residence of Col and Phyl Ramsay on Sunday 10th of February 2013. Present at the meeting were Alan Bach, Mark Tramby and Col Ramsay. Brain Fulmer, Ken Wright and Bob Ireland attended electronically.

It was decided that:

- Ken and Bob were welcomed to the National board as per a motion passed at the November meeting.
- Discussion was held regarding our ASIC registration as well as the registration of the Apex 40 emblem. It was decided unanimously that these two items should be in place prior to the AGM and so action has been taken to do so. We are also proposing to register apex40.com.au and apex40.org.au.
- Although Apex Malaysia has removed the age limit for membership, we have contacted them re Apex 40 and await their response.
- To revisit Apex 40 material:- This is still in the early stages and I will advise the outcome in the Next Roaring 40's and or by email to secretaries (Name Badges, Lapel Badges, Stickers, Banners etc.).
- To revisit the MOU with Apex Foundation. This is still in progress.
- To better co-ordinate with Apex to improve relations. This is also still in progress.

WEB site:

Our webmaster Ken Wright has done a complete re write of the website, so pay it a visit and keep up to date with all things Apex 40. Ken desperately needs your input to keep this up to date. Please forward any news, photographs and your dinner notices for inclusion.

Insurance:

Ken has placed copies of the "Association Liability" and the "Voluntary Workers" certificates on the web site. For the benefit of members and groups more details will appear in the near future.

Membership:

Registration forms from Sub Committees have continued to come in, but we are still missing several. A few groups have not forwarded me their 2013 member details or payment so I would ask again if they would please do so urgently so as to enable me to update the register prior to the AGM.

Six years ago, we had 39 active groups, today we only appear to have 31 and for many years we have had an ageing membership.

Increasing membership has been put high on National Board's list of priorities. Bob Ireland now has the new membership Directorship and is working with Apex Liaison to spread the words " For Continuing Fellowship ". Many of our well established groups have not been able to attract new members, so possibly forming new groups may be the answer. Also many Apex Clubs now have 'Associate Members' with no age limit and sometimes rely on these members to remain viable. In chasing membership it will remain our intent to complement Apex and not compete.

Membership fees:

I have had several emails and telephone calls regarding our annual membership fee. I would like to point out that the membership fee of \$ 6.00 per person covers the cost of Administration and Insurance, there being NO additional fee for Insurance. Some members/Groups had expected that there would be an additional cost for the Insurance, this is **NOT** the case.
