

APEX MAKES AGE LIMIT OPTIONAL AT CLUB LEVEL.

At the recent AGM of the Association of Apex Clubs held in September at Mudjimba Apex Camp in Queensland, a change to the constitution was narrowly passed giving individual Clubs the option to extend the age limits at Club level.

It was by no means unanimous and was the result of a considerable amount of direct lobbying by Berowra Waters Apex who collected enough proxies to carry the motion.

There was some conjecture whether the proxies held were valid at the AGM, however subsequent legal advice has now confirmed their validity.

The official retiring age at Association level remains at 45 years. There will be limitations on the involvement of members older than 45 years, however the full details are not yet currently available. I understand the minutes of the AGM will be distributed through the Apex eNewsletter with more details on that issue.

Whether all Clubs, or for that matter their individual members, will take up this option is yet to be seen. The flow on effect to Anay and to Anay 40 is unknown however I have

yet to be seen. The now on effect to Apex and to Apex 40 is unknown nowever I hope	
to be able to provide members with more detail in the next edition of Roaring 40's.
