

We all like to discover hidden secrets, Inverell is one of those special places.

Tucked snuggly into the Macintyre Valley at the foot of the New England Ranges, Inverell is known far & wide as "The Sapphire City". As the name suggests, Inverell is one of the true gems of the New England region of NSW & a place that should be on your bucket list to visit.

The Inverell Shire is within the Kamilaroi Nation & home to local & visiting Aboriginal people representing many Aboriginal tribes & language groups. These include Jukumbal, Kwiambal, Nucoorilma, Anaiwan, Ngoorabul, Marbul & Banbai peoples.

The area remains mostly unspoiled with real country hospitality one of the town's greatest charms. From beautiful boutique stores to spacious National Parks, magnificent waterways to a diverse selection of gems & minerals, there is something for every member of the family. Inverell has a rich history evident in many facades encompassing the Central Business District, which can be enjoyed by taking a leisurely heritage walk, or wandering through museums, galleries & monuments.

Inverell was settled in 1836 after Alexander Campbell arrived & established 2 properties. Inverell takes its name from the Gaelic, meaning meeting place of the swans; owing to the large number of black swans in the area at

the time of settlement. Records show that several Aboriginal tribal boundaries intersected within the Inverell district well before the European settlement.


